hile going through recruitment in the '60s, Norm Blake '64 was impressed with the reputation of the Indiana Beta Chapter of Σ AE and the quality of brothers it produced. Fast forward to 2019 and not much has changed. As he reflects on those early years, Norm sees greatness on the horizon for the men of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

At ΣAE , Norm developed lifelong friendships, learned from his shortcomings and mistakes, and met

his future wife. Lessons learned at Indiana Beta no doubt set the stage for what became a successful career. Over the years, he held a variety of senior officer level positions, including strategic planner for Jack Welch (CEO of General Electric), chairman and CEO of three Fortune 500 companies, and CEO of the United States Olympic Committee.


Looking to the future, Norm wants ΣAE to "become the best house on campus." He hopes the chapter can "be a leader in the community and have a membership of achievers that are going to be difference makers in life." Norm is making this vision become reality by ensuring the Indiana Beta chapter house is the top fraternity house with a donation to the *Tradition of Excellence* capital campaign.

"My Σ AE experience was valuable to me and made me a better person to face the realities of life. I wanted to ensure that others would have the opportunity of becoming better as a result of their experience of being a brother at Σ AE."

Norm knows more donations are needed to see the project through to completion. He hopes all brothers will join him in donating. "There are givers and takers in life," he said. "If you enjoyed and gained from your experience as being a member of ΣAE , you should feel a sense of obligation to give back so that others can enjoy a similar experience."

Staying active with ΣAE over the years, Norm serves on the House Corporation and maintains contact with many of his brothers, including **Keith Johnson '63**, **Jack Harris '64**, and **Bob Frushour '63**. Indiana Beta has been a part of Norm's life for more than 50 years. And with campaign support from his brothers, it will create lasting bonds for generations of future brothers.

INDIANA BETA'S BASKETBALL LEGEND

TERRY DISCHINGER '62 NAMED TO 2019 NATIONAL COLLEGIATE BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME CLASS

s one of the all-time great student-athletes in Purdue history,

Terry Dischinger '62 spent hours on end in Lambert Fieldhouse
becoming the best basketball player he could be. While Terry's
accolades on the court only scratch the surface in describing the caliber of
player he was, he also took great pride in his studies. Terry balanced his
hours off the court by studying in the quarters of the attic of the Indiana
Beta chapter house.

"I was a chemical engineering student and also an athlete," Terry said. "I needed to study each night to get through the way I wanted. It worked out really well."

Terry is thankful for a brotherhood like Sigma Alpha Epsilon that not only made him feel at home but supported his dreams. From setting scoring records at Purdue, being named the 1962-63 NBA Rookie of the Year, making three NBA All-Star teams, and playing on the 1960 Olympic gold medal team, Terry gave his ΣAE brothers a lot to be proud of.

At the age of 78, Terry's basketball career is still being recognized. He will be inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame on November 24 in Kansas City, Missouri.

While Terry has been told by many former teammates, friends, and family members that the hall of fame induction is long overdue, the timing doesn't make much of a difference to him. He has relived a lot of great Purdue basketball memories since learning in April that he would be inducted along with Calbert Cheaney, Shane Battier, Ernie DiGregorio, Larry Johnson, and Todd Lichti and former coaches Homer Drew, Lute Olson, and Rick Majerus (posthumously).

"You find out that you still have a lot of friends," Terry said. "It's really been neat for me during this time with this happening."

At Purdue, Terry ranks sixth all-time in scoring (1,979 points) and second in rebounds (954). He was named to the all-Big Ten team three times and earned All-American honors in each of his three varsity seasons. Terry loved playing for Purdue and is still a proud supporter of Boilermaker athletics, but the highlight of his college career didn't involve him wearing a PU jersey.

At the age of 19, Terry was the youngest player to ever suit up for the United States in the Olympics. Playing alongside the likes of Jerry West, Jerry Lucas, and his hero, Oscar Robertson, was a dream come true.

"It was an unreal situation because Oscar Robertson was my hero and he turned out to be my roommate. It's just beyond me and I think it's beyond most people when they are there and are watching our team winning and beating everybody by a big margin," Terry said. "The thing about it when you're in the Olympics, you're not playing for Purdue or anything like that. You're playing for the United States of America. When you finally win and you're on the podium and they put the medal around your neck, it's hard to hold the tears in."

Sports remain a big part of Terry's life with golf being his favorite hobby. Terry also loves traveling internationally with his wife, Mary, whom he married the day before they graduated from Purdue. You can connect with Terry at tmdisch@comcast.net.

The end of a successful recruitment season has brought 42 new members to the chapter, placing us at about 170 in total with 60 live-in members.

After doubling our \$10,000 philanthropic donation goal and receiving the IFC Philanthropist of the Year award, we are pushing to hit \$20,000 this semester. Philanthropic events in the works include TG Tuesdays (semiweekly food stands on campus), our Big Digs volleyball tournament, and we plan for strong participation in Purdue University Dance Marathon coming up November 9-10. We are confident these philanthropic activities will help us achieve our increased goal—just a few highlights of what the 2019-20 academic year has to offer.

STRIVING FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

At a 3.02 cumulative GPA, we continue to place above both the all-fraternity and all-men averages. Even more impressively, our chapter has seen an 88% four-year graduation rate, almost 30% higher than the overall university rate.

We are striving to reach a 3.10 cumulative by fall 2020, which, when paired with a positive image and newly instilled values of the fall recruits, gives our chapter everything we need to continue growing in Σ AE.
